klia2, as one of Malaysia's newest public infrastructure has garnered much interest especially with regards to its ongoing soil settlement.

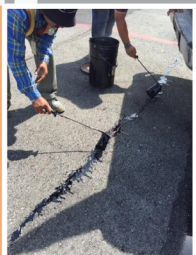
As part of our continuous stakeholder engagement, Malaysia Airports would like to inform the public on the type of planned maintenance works being carried out and the progress that we have achieved in addressing the settlement as well as ensuring that klia2 is safe for operations.

Issues & Solutions



In the course of normal settlement, **surface cracks** occur when two uneven layers shift against each other.

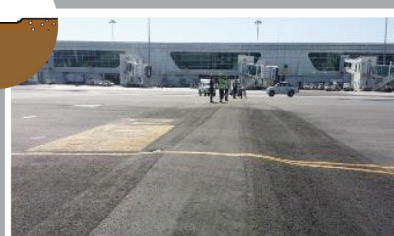
Solution - Filling in the gaps with bituminous base sealant to prevent water seeping into the pavement.



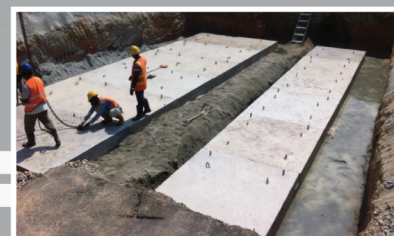
Water Ponding occurs when uneven surfaces allow water to accumulate.



Solution - Overlaying the pavement level to even out the surface.



Differential settlement occurs due to the unequal settlement in adjacent areas.



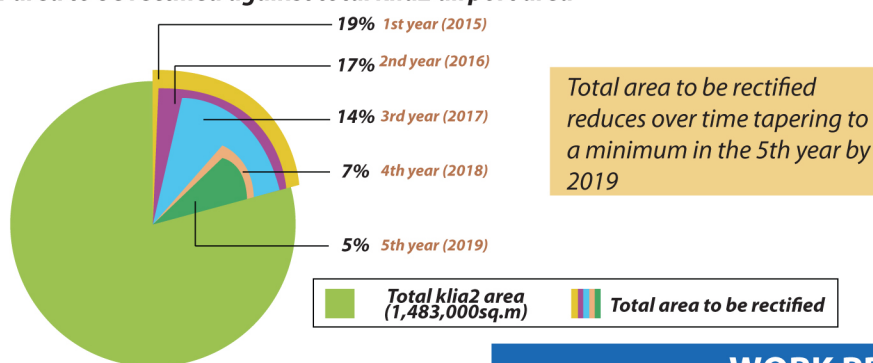
Solution - Installing precast concrete slab to reduce the impact of differential settlement.

OVERVIEW OF MAINTENANCE MASTERPLAN

Malaysia Airports has laid out a 5-year masterplan to address these issues. Our work plan is staggered over 5 years to minimise disruption to airport operations.

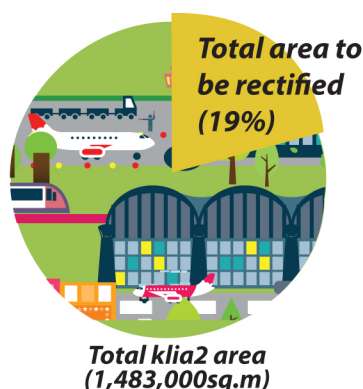

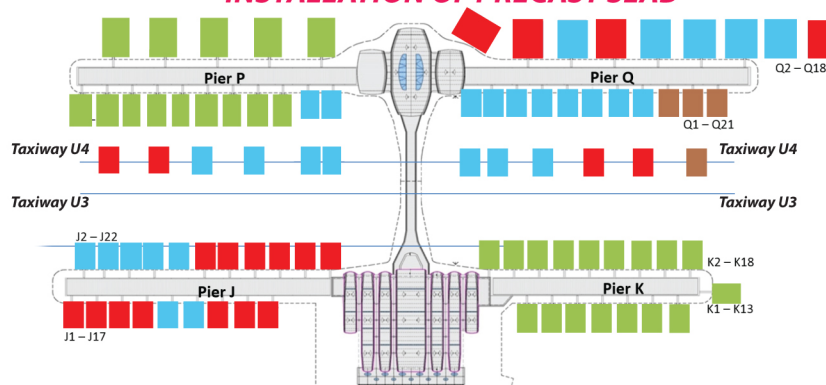
We are happy to share as at 31 August 2015, our rectification works progress has been successful and is on schedule.
